Dear Chief Kidd:

The Department of Homeland Security/Federal Emergency Management Agency (DHS/FEMA) Region 6 received the Texas 2022 Annual Letter of Certification (ALC) of Radiological Emergency Preparedness (REP) program activities. These items summarize REP activities in Texas, as documented by the detailed examples provided by your office, for Comanche Peak Nuclear Power Plant, South Texas Project, and the State of Texas.

The FEMA Region 6 staff reviewed the contents of the ALC against criteria provided in our guidance documents, Radiological Emergency Preparedness Program Manual, dated January 2016 concerning ALC reporting requirements. Based upon compliance with NUREG-0654/FEMA REP-1, 44 CFR 350, and the Radiological Emergency Preparedness Program Manual, your ALC will remain on file in the DHS/FEMA Region 6 office as verification that the outlined activities have been successfully accomplished. We have also notified our headquarters office of your ALC submission and provided them a copy of your cover letter.

I want to emphasize the importance of the ALC, since this information is part of what FEMA uses in making reasonable assurance findings and determinations on offsite radiological emergency plans and preparedness.
